Membership Subscriptions for 2016 and Gift Aid Declaration

Our membership subscriptions for the period January to December 2016 are now due. **There is no increase in the annual subscription for 2016. It will remain at £35, so I'm sure you will agree that our U3A is remarkably good value for money.** May I ask you to:

In fact, higher rate tax payers benefit from making the declaration. You are entitled to tick the Yes Box if you do pay tax, but many members do not realise they are paying tax because it has been deducted at source, for example on an occupational income or on investments. If you are in doubt please contact me. I will not enquire into your circumstances. Talk by Ben Fielding: A History of Poland and Lithuania – Rise, Ruin and Rebirth

Poland is not a country that often impinges on many people's consciousness or appears in school curricula. Yet the EU's largest member state beyond the former Iron Curtain has as rich and turbulent a history as many neighbouring Slav states. Indeed, for several centuries it formed, in union with neighbouring Lithuania, the largest single state in Europe. Ben is expert in this field and in this illustrated talk he will introduce us to the fascinating history of two countries that most of us know so little about.
