# Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2.15pm at the Hi Tide:Talk by Martyn Popham and Neil Tapper Parc Stormy - from a Brownfield Site to a Green Future

Parc Stormy has been redeveloped from a rundown brownfield site into a cluster of Interconnected Renewable Technologies. The concept is modelled on Güssing in Austria, where a vibrant local economy has been created using the natural resources and waste products of the town and the surrounding area. Parc Stormy has a wind turbine and uses low carbon technology invented by Cardiff University to generate energy from mineral and other waste. It also has battery storage and there are plans for the installation of a hydrogen re-fuelling station. The initiative aims to demonstrate to future generations the effective development of low carbon energy production and the significant environmental and economic benefits that can be gained. This will be a fascinating and thought-provoking afternoon led by the managing director and the senior engineer of the company responsible for this exciting initiative. Do come along if you can.

# Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> July: ARCHAEOLOGY GROUP'S ANNUAL TRIP OPEN TO ALL MEMBERS

This year we will be visiting the **Newport Medieval Ship**, the best preserved 15th Century ship ever found. We will be given a talk about its excavation and preservation and the information it has given us about shipping and trade in that period. Following lunch, we will visit the famous **Newport Transporter Bridge**, for a talk on its history, and a ride across the Usk. The bridge was designed by a French man and opened in 1906, and is one of only seven transporter bridges left in the world.

We require a group minimum of 20 for the Transporter Bridge visit, so do come along! We will meet on 19th July at the Porthcawl Rugby Club car park and will share transport. We will actually depart at 9.30 am, so aim to arrive about 9.15 am.

# Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> July: Visit to Malmesbury Abbey and the Abbey House Gardens

The coach for this visit will leave the Atlantic Hotel at 8.30am and Sainsbury's Bridgend at 8.50am (approx). The original abbey was built in the 7<sup>th</sup> century. By the 11<sup>th</sup> century it housed the second largest library in Europe and was considered one of the leading European centres of learning. The present abbey was completed in 1180,, and after the Dissolution the abbey church was returned to the town as a parish church. Among its many interesting features are the tombs of the grandson of Alfred the Great and of King Aethelstan The Abbey House Gardens cover 5 acres, include over 10,000 different plants and have featured on several television programmes. The cost of the visit to include coach fare and entry to the Gardens is £22.
