Dear parents/carers,

As the autumn term draws to a close and we near the Christmas break, as I did last year, I would like to offer a few words to reflect on 2024. It really has been another 'excellent' year at PCS - filled with new developments, exceptional achievement, and moments that have enriched the lives of the students at Porthcawl Comprehensive School. I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to all families for entrusting us with the education and development of your son/daughter. Your support, dedication and involvement has played a significant part in making 2024 another successful year.

There have been notable successes this term with the school being awarded the Carnegie Mental Health Gold Award in recognition of our excellent whole school approach to mental health and wellbeing provision. In addition, we achieved the Cyber First Gold Award for recognition in delivering 'excellence' in cyber security education. The school has been an incredibly busy place over the last 15 weeks with several activities, trips, guest speakers and residential events taking place. To name a few, these include, the Lille Christmas Market trip, the U13 South Wales Tennis Championships, the Young Playwrights' Festival, a Future Chef Event, the Year 9 First Give Project, a Year 7 Welsh Theatre Trip and most recently our Annual Carol Service at All Saints Church. There have also been numerous charity events including Children in Need, a Foodbank collection, and a Community Christmas Celebration coordinated by our Wellbeing Ambassadors for members of the local community.

In October we received an Interim Visit from Estyn. This visit focussed on the two of the recommendations from our last Core Inspection. We enjoyed sharing the work we have completed to date, and we were particularly pleased that the inspection team noted:

- The substantial amount of work undertaken by senior leaders to revise our processes for selfevaluation and planning for improvement;
- How senior leaders have collaborated with staff to develop a set of pedagogical principles to improve consistency and create a culture of high-quality teaching and learning;
- How our team of teaching and learning champions have developed useful resources, such as the teaching and learning toolkit, to support teachers in developing their practice;
- How leaders support departments helpfully to provide pupils with opportunities to develop their literacy skills across the curriculum;

- That our self-evaluation and planning for improvement work has a stronger focus on learning and teaching;
- That teachers are supported to improve their practice with a helpful professional learning offer, which includes useful support material for developing teaching; and
- How the 'Porthcawl Pedagogical Principles' provides a beneficial framework for evaluation and is helping teachers to develop a shared understanding of the school's strategic approach to teaching and learning.

We will continue to develop and improve all that we do, to ensure the very best for the students at Porthcawl Comprehensive School. I am very proud of our work and achievements to date.

As shared in our Autumn Term 2024 Edition of the Porthcawl Post, through school events and activities, we have achieved so much! Our pupils have excelled in competitions, showcased their talents in music, science and mathematics. They have participated in drama productions and demonstrated excellence in sport – to name a few! Across the curriculum, we have celebrated their progress, their community work and their overall efforts that embody the 'Curriculum for Porthcawl' and 'The Porthcawl Pupil'. I have thoroughly enjoyed celebrating success and achievement via the Porthcawl Pupil of the Week – it is the highlight of my week!

I look forward to more celebration and recognition in 2025.
